Albena needed ventilatory support and stayed in hospital for three months.

Today, she is an active girl who likes singing and drawing. She also enjoys climbing and playing with her friends outdoors.





LUKAS Germany

Lukas and his twin sister Lena were born too early and too tiny. Sadly, Lena died one week after birth. Lukas survived his first weeks without further complications. However, many challenges lay ahead of him including numerous surgical procedures.

Meanwhile, Lukas has grown into a healthy teenager who attends high-school and counts playing the violin among his hobbies. His career goal is to become a profiler.





Szymon Poland

Szymon was immediately intubated after birth and admitted to the intensive care unit where he remained for 110 days. He was ventilated for six weeks and underwent surgery for Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP).

After discharge, Szymon needed further neurological, cardiological, and ophthalmological care as well as physiotherapy. Today he is a happy and cheerful boy with a passion for cars, tractors, and construction machines.





Elžbieta Lithuania

After her early birth, Elžbieta's health condition was extremely difficult and life-threatening. She remained in hospital for 103 days during which she was treated with 21 different kinds of medicines and underwent two inevitable surgeries.

Today, her parents describe her as a strong-natured, brave and curious little girl. The quality her parents admire most is her ability to enjoy life.

Linnea Isabel was born by Caesarean section at 27 weeks and three days of gestational age. In the NICU, she had to cope with complications, such as immature bowels, Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP) and severe sepsis. After 100 days, Linnea Isabel was discharged from hospital. However, she had undergone colostomy and needed tube feeding.

Today, Linnea Isabel is very active. She likes physical activities in general, and dancing in particular. Due to her ROP she continues to wear glasses.





Francesco Italy

Francesco's preterm birth happened within few hours and his parents remember it as a traumatising event. Fortunately, no major complications occurred in the following months.

Francesco is now studying Communication sciences in Munich. Besides being an avid football lover, he is very interested in music, politics, history, and philosophy.





Elise Belgium

Elise could not breathe by herself. She needed ventilation and stayed in hospital for seven weeks. Her preterm birth led to a movement disorder and a visual impairment.

Elise has grown into a happy girl and a good student. Besides art school, she enjoys swimming, biking with her tricycle and playing wheelchair basketball.





Mil O France

Little Milo needed to stay in the neonatal intensive care unit for two months.

Milo is now a healthy and headstrong child, always cheerful and full of energy. He enjoys drawing and listening to music. Also he is a fan of Spiderman. 'A hero like him,' his mother proudly adds.

Ella's preterm birth was very challenging for her parents. But they felt that their tiny daughter needed them to be there for her.

Now, Ella's parents describe her as a little girl who is smiling and singing all the time. They feel that they did the best they could for her then and that she is giving it all back to them now.



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
